H. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR COMMENTS

Johnnie Wardell informed the board that Dennis Edwards, Medical Services Director, retired earlier this month and we are evaluating the programmatic and organizational needs prior to filling the position in order to recruit for the right knowledge, skills and abilities. The 88th Legislature began on January 10 and you recently received the Texas Council document, "What Every Board Member Should be Talking About" that highlights the legislative priorities for our system of care. On January 18 the initial house

and senate budgets were published. This initial budget has a significant increase, in both the house and senate versions, for mental health. Both versions of the budget include matching funding levels for mental health, no increased funding for IDD and an increase for ECI that only accounts for the increase in the number of children being served, the funding per child stays flat. We anticipate exceptional items to be filed to address the IDD and ECI shortfalls.

I. <u>BOARD OF TRUSTEES COMMENTS/MEETING EFFECTIVENESS FEEDBACK</u>

Virgie Hardeman: I think it is a good idea to move forward with the Copperas Cove building and I would like to be included in the Milam County meetings in February.

Dr. Andrejs Avots-Avotins: Great meeting today. Thank you for sending the legislative priorities. I think this will be the year we can all work together to get all services back on track and overcome the workforce problems. Mental Health First Aid for youth was last Friday and was well attended. Great potential for collaboration going forward.

Steve Wick: Thank you for the executive session and I think we made the right choices. I want to let everyone know about an article I just found concerning the rising suicide rates in rural communities. There has been a 46% increase in rural American resident's suicide rates and rural residents visit the ER 5 times more than the general population for self-harm.

Sheriff Jess Ramos: I appreciate Steve bringing that up about the suicide rate because we have had an increase in suicide rates that started last year. Thank you all for your work.

Dr. Louella Tate: I am happy. Thank you.

Rita Kelley: Good meeting. Appreciate the opportunity to discuss the building. Thank to everyone for your efforts on that. Appreciate the legislative report. I would love to be included in the list serve of the upcoming reports.

Felicia Inman: Thank you Mr. Wick for sharing the suicide information. I am excited about Coryell County and upcoming things for all our locations.

Jack Tarver: I appreciate the Boards participation about the building in Copperas Cove. I hope we can put that to good use.

Ray Ashby: Thank you Johnnie and thank you the leadership. Thank you to the Board.
